Just before the 1988 Winter Olympics, a television program aired that featured blind skiers being trained for slalom skiing. The blind skiers were paired with sighted skiers and were taught how to make right and left turns. Can You Hear God Speaking?

It is breathtaking to think that mere humans can have conversations with the One who created the heavens and the earth. Yet the Bible assures us we can, that the Creator of everything is also our loving Father.

When you were young, didn't you ask your father or mother for whatever you needed, then trust your parent to provide it? Jesus promises us, in effect, "If you, imperfect as all humans are, give good gifts to your children, how much more will your Heavenly Father give good things to all who ask him for them" (Matthew 7:11).

In God's wonderful creation, He has provided food and shelter for everything from oysters and earthworms to sparrows and eagles, deer and elephants. The God who takes good care of birds and flowers will look after us "much more" if we give him his rightful place in our lives (Matthew 6:26-33).

God longs to talk with you even more than you want to speak to Him. Here are four ways He speaks to us:

1. God speaks through nature.

The glory of God is revealed in the universe with its billions of galaxies and the intelligent order revealed in every creature, every flower, every atom and sub-atom. Psalm 19:1 tells us: "The heavens declare the glory of God; the skies proclaim the work of his hands."

2. God speaks in our hearts.

Everyone in the world knows that it is wrong to steal, to lie, to kill, to harm others. God's law is written on our hearts, as the Apostle Paul says in Romans 2:14-15: "Indeed, when Gentiles, who do not have the law, do by nature things required by the law, they are a law for themselves...since they show that the requirements of the law are written on their hearts."

3. God speaks through Scripture.

"All Scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness... (2 Timothy 3:16). As we read the Bible faithfully, God's will for us becomes more and more clear.

4. God speaks to us through Jesus Christ, the Living Word.

"In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us" (John 1:1, 14). Jesus has experienced every trial we have. He knows how hard life can be—but he also knows the way out. Therefore, through him we can find "grace to help in time of need" (Hebrews 4:16).

As you come into God's presence, your prayers need not be long or fancy. Martin Luther said, "The fewer words, the better prayer."

Your Father knows your needs better than you do—and is waiting to help you. "Before they call I will answer; while they are still speaking I will hear" (Isaiah 65:24).

So make your prayers—and your life—a conversation with your Almighty Father.

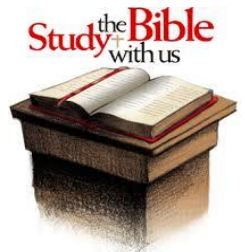

Atrial Fibrillation (AFib) Awareness Month

AFib Feels Like...



Atrial Fibrillation — also known as AFib or AF — is the most common arrhythmia. It affects more than 2.5 million American adults and 4.5 million people living in the European Union, and accounts for approximately one-third of hospitalizations for cardiac rhythm disturbances. It is characterized by a rapid and irregular heartbeat caused when the top chambers of the heart (the atria) quiver (fibrillate) erratically, sometimes faster than 200 times per minute. The condition can have a significant negative impact on an individual's quality of life, causing heart palpitations, chronic fatigue, debilitating pain and can increase the risk of stroke fivefold. The Heart Rhythm Society (HRS) and National Stroke Association, in collaboration with Boehringer Ingelheim (BI), fielded an Atrial Fibrillation - Impact of Stroke Survey in May of 2014 to physicians, atrial fibrillation (AFib) patients and caregivers. The purpose of the survey was to measure awareness about AFib and stroke, determine baseline understanding of risk factors, and identify barriers to communication between patients/caregivers and providers.

AFibRisk.org The AFib Risk Assessment is an interactive tool designed to help individuals estimate their risk of atrial fibrillation (AFib). Many individuals living with AFib have no symptoms and are unaware of their condition until they are suffering from complications, which may require emergency treatment. Learn your risk by using this online tool!

Prostate Cancer Awareness Month

Prostate Cancer is a story of both great heartbreak and great hope. The heartbreak is that each year more than 29,000 men will die of this disease and that prostate cancer is the second leading cause of cancer death of U.S. men. However, if diagnosed early, the five-year survival rate is almost 100 percent. At ten years post diagnosis, 98 percent of men diagnosed early, remain alive.

Prostate cancer is an extremely complex disease—multiple subtypes of this cancer exist, some aggressive and lethal, others non-aggressive and non-life-threatening. The vast majority of prostate cancer occurs as an indolent, slow-growing form of the disease that poses little threat to men's lifespans. Because one in six men will be diagnosed with prostate cancer in their lifetime, it is important for men to learn about both non-aggressive, slow-growing forms of prostate cancer and aggressive forms of this disease through conversations with their doctors. In addition, because there has been controversy in recent years over when men should be screened for prostate cancer, there is great need for all men to learn about prostate cancer screening methods, including the drawbacks and benefits to current screening tests.

The Prostate Cancer Foundation (PCF) is a leader in funding and accelerating the world's most promising prostate cancer research. And PCF is also a go-to organization for disseminating prostate health information to men. PCF is proud to offer multiple forms of information about this disease to men and their loved ones.

And all your joys in the gold."

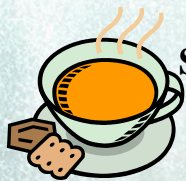
I heeded His words, and in the two boxes
