6 Ways to Pray on the 4th of July by Bob Hostetler

In addition to fireworks and parades, celebrate Independence Day with prayer. For most of us, the 4th of July will be a day of food, fireworks and maybe a parade or concert. But it can also include prayer. But, I suggest, not just any prayer. Try praying this way on Independence Day:

1. Give thanks for your freedom and favor.

What a blessing it is to enjoy the freedoms we too often take for granted and the blessings that attend us in this country.

2. Pray for those who protect our freedom.

Remember those who fought and died for our freedom in the past and those soldiers, sailors, police and others whose service protects us today.

3. Pray for our nation's leaders.

Paul, the early church leader, wrote, "I urge, then, first of all, that petitions, prayers, intercession and thanksgiving be made for all people—for kings and all those in authority, that we may live peaceful and quiet lives in all godliness and holiness. This is good, and pleases God our Savior" (1 Timothy 2:1-3, NIV). If he were writing today, Paul would probably include not only the president and other national officials but also members of congress, governors, judges and others in positions of authority.

4. Pray for the safety of those who gather to celebrate the holiday.

In this day and age, any large gathering presents security challenges large and small. Ask God to grant wisdom and watchfulness to planners and hosts of events—as well as the usual need for caution in handling fireworks and other seasonal hazards.

5. Remember those in oppressive or disadvantaged circumstances.

As we express gratitude for our freedoms, we should also remember those who live in different circumstances where war, oppression, discrimination and injustice divide and dominate. Even as you rejoice in your blessings, cry out to God for those who suffer.

6. Find new freedom in forgiveness.

There is no bad time to forgive someone but there are few better times than on a day when we celebrate freedom. Take a moment to consider whether there is someone you can forgive or something in your life that you can let go. Why not include in this year's celebration a new level of freedom by shaking off the shackles of unforgiveness or regret—perhaps even seeking God's forgiveness or forgiving yourself, and experiencing the truth of Romans 8:1-2: "There is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus, because through Christ Jesus the law of the Spirit who gives life has set you free from the law of sin and death" (Romans 8:1-2, NIV).

Riding on Coattails of Love and Lessons by Michelle Cox

Thinking about all who have helped shape a life of faith and joy.

As a child, I remember first hearing the expression, riding on someone's coattails. That sounded so funny to me back then. But as an adult looking back over my life, I've ridden a lot of coattails.

There were the dedicated teachers from whom I learned discipline, commitment and character as well as reading, writing and arithmetic. I'm grateful for their influence and wonderful memories of time spent in their classrooms.

I've ridden the coattails of family members who came before me, people I've traced back to the earliest days of our country. There's the Civil War grandfather on my husband's side of the family who died from his wounds in battle, but before he died, wrote a letter telling his wife to raise their children for the Lord. Because of their faithfulness, my children have had a wonderful, godly dad.

There's my maternal great-great-grandmother. Family members tell how as she was dying, she was praying for her children, grandchildren and future generations. I wonder how many times I've ridden on the coattails from that sweet woman's prayers? It brings tears to my eyes as I think about this and look at my sons. Two of them are in ministry today preaching the gospel. The other is active in his church's music ministry. They're still riding on her coattails, on her prayers that have reached through the generations.

I've ridden the coattails of my daddy, uncles and aunt who served in the military—and thousands more just like them. Because of their sacrifice, we have the priceless gift of being free. We can sleep at night in peace and safety. And we can celebrate the 4th of July with family, fireworks and picnics of hot dogs and hamburgers, watermelon and homemade ice cream.

I'm grateful for all of these coattails—for all who've touched my life—but as I sit here writing today, it makes me consider the coattails that I, in turn, will leave behind.

Please, God, let future generations remember a woman who loved You, her family, country and others. Help them know that I prayed for them and that I was faithful to serve You. If others grasp my coattails, help me to lead them toward You. Amen.

Health Awareness

The National Health Information Center (NHIC) has dedicated the whole month of July to cord blood awareness. Today, stem cells are mainly used in the treatment of disease and in tissue regeneration. They largely come from one of three sources cord blood, bone marrow and peripheral blood. Cord blood stem cells are found in the blood of the umbilical cord. With their instant availability at birth and demonstrated utility, cord blood is quickly becoming a well-known source of stem cells by transplant physicians. After a baby is born, and the umbilical cord is clamped and cut, the blood left in the umbilical cord can be collected and the stem cells extracted and stored for potential use in a future medical application.
