For God has not given us a spirit of fear and timidity, but of power, love, and self-discipline. (2 Timothy 1:7)

The month of October has been designated Pastor Appreciation month. Some people think that all pastors do is preach sermons, but they do so much more. They are called to cast vision so their congregants can understand where they are going. You can thank them for the time they spend comforting family during the illness or death of loved ones. Many pastors like to read and a good book or a gift card for a book or a meal out is another way to show appreciation. Recently, someone told me that a great way to show appreciation is through giving a retreat weekend or even a day at a retreat center. These are refreshing times that pastors need. You don't have to wait for a particular month; you can show your appreciation at any time. Sometimes just saying "thank you" is enough. We are praying for all pastors to excel and bring God glory. I know that he appreciates them and so do we. When they live a fearless life, they will not fail. God bless you!



# **Health Care Ministry**October is Breast Cancer Awareness Month

Other than skin cancer, breast cancer is the most common cancer among American women. Mammograms are the best way to find breast cancer early, when it is easier to treat and before it is big enough to feel or cause symptoms.

#### What Are the Symptoms?

There are different symptoms of breast cancer, and some people have no symptoms at all. Symptoms can include—

- Any change in the size or the shape of the breast.
- Pain in any area of the breast.
- Nipple discharge other than breast milk (including blood).
- A new lump in the breast or underarm.

If you have any signs that worry you, see your doctor right away.

#### PINK OUT SUNDAY

In observance of Breast Cancer Awareness, disciples are asked to wear something **PINK** on 5<sup>th</sup> Sunday, October 31<sup>st</sup>.

#### What Are the Risk Factors?

Some main factors that affect your chance of getting breast cancer include—being a woman, being older – most breast cancers are found in women who are 50 years old or older, having changes in your BRCA1 or BRCA2 genes.

#### **How Can I Lower My Risk?**

You can do things to help lower your breast cancer risk.

- Keep a healthy weight and exercise regularly.
- Don't drink alcohol, or limit the amount of alcohol you drink.
- If you are taking hormone replacement therapy or birth control pills, ask your doctor about the risks.
- Breastfeed your children, if possible.

Although breast cancer screening cannot prevent breast cancer, it can help find breast cancer early, when it is easier to treat.

#### **Fast Facts about Breast Cancer**

- Each year in the United States, about 255,000 women get breast cancer and 42,000 women die from the disease.
- Men also get breast cancer, but it is not very common. About 1 out of every 100 breast cancers diagnosed in the United States is found in a man.
- Most breast cancers are found in women who are 50 years old or older, but breast cancer also affects younger women.
